I am pleased to present our report, *Arizona Public School Districts' Dollars Spent in the Classroom, Fiscal Year* 2002. We prepared this report in response to the Arizona Revised Statutes §41-1279.03 requirement to determine the percentage of every dollar Arizona school districts spend in the classroom. This report also describes how districts used Classroom Site Fund monies resulting from Proposition 301, the education sales tax that voters approved in November 2000. To provide a quick summary for your convenience, I am also including a copy of the Report Highlights.

Our analysis of fiscal year 2002 district accounting data found varied results with regard to classroom spending. Overall, Arizona's statewide average spent in the classroom increased slightly to 58.2 percent, compared with 57.7 percent the year before. However, many districts decreased the percentage of non-Proposition 301 monies they spent in the classroom. If districts had spent their non-Proposition 301 monies in fiscal year 2002 in the same manner they spent those monies the year before, the additional \$196 million in Proposition 301 expenditures would have raised the 2002 percentage to 59.1 percent.

Similar to last year, two-thirds of Arizona districts were near the state average for classroom spending, yet overall districts' percentages, excluding certain special-purpose districts, ranged from about 34 to 89 percent. Factors associated with higher classroom spending continue to be larger student populations and higher average teacher salaries. Conversely, higher food service, transportation, and administration costs were associated with lower classroom dollar spending.

Our review found that districts used Proposition 301 monies almost solely for instructional staff's salaries and benefits. This complies with the requirement that districts use at least 60 percent of the monies for teacher compensation. Based on district-reported data, teacher salary increases attributable to Proposition 301 averaged 8.8 percent.

My staff and I will be pleased to discuss or clarify items in the report.

SUMMARY

The Office of the Auditor General has conducted an analysis of Arizona school districts' percentage of dollars spent in the classroom during fiscal year 2002. In addition, this report describes how districts spent Classroom Site Fund monies resulting from Proposition 301, the education sales tax approved by voters in November 2000. This analysis was conducted pursuant to A.R.S. §41-1279.03, which requires the Auditor General to monitor the percentage of each dollar spent in the classroom and conduct performance audits of school districts. This is the second year conducting this analysis.

The definition of classroom dollars used in this report is the same definition developed by the US Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for "instruction". This definition, as described in Table 1 (see page 2), includes expenditures for classroom personnel, instructional supplies, instructional aids, certain tuition payments, field trips, athletics, and co-curricular activities. This definition has been applied by the NCES for a number of years, and provides a basis for comparing Arizona's results with other states, the national average, and Arizona's past performance.

Dollars in the classroom (see pages 9 through 19)

Overall, Arizona's statewide average dollars spent in the classroom increased slightly in fiscal year 2002 to 58.2 percent, compared with 57.7 percent in fiscal year 2001. As reported by the NCES, the national average for fiscal year 2000, the most recent available, was 61.7 percent.

Although the addition of Proposition 301 monies raised the statewide average to 58.2 percent, the average could have been higher still. If districts had spent their fiscal year 2002 non-Proposition 301 monies in the same manner as the previous year, the additional \$196 million in Proposition 301 expenditures would have raised the statewide average to 59.1 percent. However, many districts decreased the

percentage of non-Proposition 301 monies they spent in the classroom. We found that:

- Without Proposition 301 monies, the statewide average drops to 56.8 percent, nearly a full percentage point below the prior year.
- Without Proposition 301 monies, nearly 60 percent of districts would have had a lower classroom dollar percentage in 2002 than in the prior year.
- Even with Proposition 301 monies, more than one-third of the State's school districts had lower classroom dollar percentages in fiscal year 2002 than in 2001.

Districts showing the greatest declines in classroom dollar percentages increased their administrative costs significantly. In addition, these districts decreased their percentage of non-Proposition 301 monies allocated to instructional salaries (the major component of classroom dollars), while districts with the highest increase in classroom dollar percentages maintained or exceeded their fiscal year 2001 level of spending on instructional salaries.

Excluding certain special-purpose districts, the individual district classroom dollar percentages ranged from 34 to 89 percent. This wide range is somewhat misleading though, as two-thirds of Arizona districts were within 5 percent of the state average. The State's smallest districts and special-purpose districts tend to have either very high or very low spending in non-classroom areas, such as administration or food service.

Factors associated with higher classroom dollar percentages continue to be larger student populations and higher average teacher salaries. Conversely, higher food service, transportation, administration, and federal and state program costs were associated with lower classroom dollar percentages.

Districts' uses of Proposition 301 monies (see pages 21 through 27)

Districts spent \$196.5 million of the nearly \$251 million distributed to them for fiscal year 2002. The remaining amounts, which were carried over to fiscal year 2003, were typically unspent due to late distribution of the monies and delayed performance measure data.

Districts used Proposition 301 monies almost solely for teacher compensation. This complies with the requirement that at least 60 percent of the monies be used for

teacher compensation. According to salary data collected by the Arizona Department of Education, the State's average teacher salary increased from \$37,176 in 2001 to \$39,973 in 2002. Based on district-reported data, teacher salary increases attributable to Proposition 301 monies averaged 8.8 percent, but ranged from less than 1 to 20 percent. The amounts attributable to these pay increases ranged from \$280 to \$5,875 per eligible employee, on average.

While most monies were used for teacher compensation, districts also used a portion of their monies for some of the other Proposition 301 purposes. One-fourth of districts spent some monies for AIMS intervention activities, about one-fifth spent some of their monies for class-size reduction and for dropout prevention programs, and 41 percent directed part of their monies to teacher development activities. Only one district reported using Proposition 301 monies for teacher liability insurance.

Appendix (see pages a-1 through a-226)

The Appendix provides alphabetically organized one-page information sheets on individual school districts. Each page summarizes the district's classroom spending and administrative costs, its reported Proposition 301 program results, and other descriptive and comparative data.

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INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

The Office of the Auditor General has, for the second year, conducted an analysis of Arizona school districts' percentage of dollars spent in the classroom. This analysis was conducted pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes §41-1279.03, which requires the Auditor General to monitor the percentage of each dollar spent in the classroom and conduct performance audits of Arizona's school districts.

In November 2000, voters approved Proposition 301. This proposition raised the state sales tax by six-tenths of 1 percent for 20 years to fund educational programs. For school districts, this funding is only to be used for specified maintenance and operation purposes, primarily increasing teacher pay.

The first distribution of Proposition 301 monies to school districts did not occur until fiscal year 2002. Our first two reports, issued before fiscal year 2002 was completed, provided baseline data on classroom dollar spending prior to the addition of Proposition 301 monies and information about how districts planned to use the Proposition 301 monies they would receive in fiscal year 2002. This report combines both subjects and reports on the following:

- Districts' fiscal year 2002 expenditures, including a comparison of classroom expenditures with fiscal year 2001, and
- Districts' actual use of Proposition 301 monies they received in fiscal year 2002.

Classroom dollars: definition and benchmarks

The definition of classroom dollars used in this report is based on the same definition developed by the US Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for "instruction". This definition is described in Table 1 (see page 2), and includes expenditures for classroom personnel, instructional supplies, instructional aids, certain tuition payments, field trips, athletics, and co-curricular

Laws 2002, Chapter 330, §50 also required the Auditor General to identify factors that help explain differences in school districts' fiscal year 2001 administrative costs and changes in those costs from fiscal year 1999 administrative costs. We issued a separate report, Factors Affecting School Districts' Administrative Costs, in November 2002, which analyzed administrative costs for fiscal year 2001. We found that Arizona school districts' fiscal year 2001 administrative costs were approximately equal to the national average.

The NCES defines current expenditures as those incurred for the day-to-day operation of schools. They include all expenditures except those associated with repaying debt, capital outlays (for example, purchases of land, buildings, and equipment), and programs outside the scope of preschool to grade 12 (for example, adult education and community services).

activities. NCES has collected school district revenue and expenditure data from all states and published comparative statistics about dollars spent on instruction since 1989. Because this definition has been applied across the country for a number of years, it provides a basis for comparing Arizona's results with other states, with the national average, and with Arizona's past performance.

NCES compiles its analysis using expenditure data provided by all states, including Arizona. This information is currently available only through fiscal year 2000. The

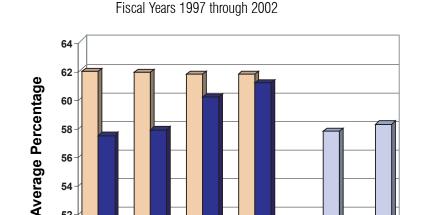

fiscal year 2001 and 2002 expenditure data for Arizona used in this report is based on our own compilations, described in further detail below.

NCES data shows that Arizona's percentage of each dollar spent on instruction through fiscal year 2000 was below, but moving closer to, the national average in recent years (see Figure 1). In particular, the most recent NCES data, which is for fiscal year 2000, showed Arizona's instruction percentage to be 61.1 percent. However, based on our analysis of districts' Annual Financial Reports and accounting data for fiscal years 2001 and 2002, the statewide average has been about 58 percent. This difference occurs because prior to fiscal year 2001, the district-level annual financial reports used to provide Arizona's data did not collect sufficient detail to provide an accurate calculation. Subsequent

changes in the forms for submitting this information should mean greater accuracy in Arizona's data submitted to and reported by NCES in 2003.

Statutory distribution of Proposition 301 monies

Under Arizona statutes, school districts receive only part of the Proposition 301 monies. Statutes define and prioritize nine education programs that receive

Proposition 301 distributions before schools. As shown in Table 2 (see page 5), the Students FIRST Debt Service Fund receives the first allocation, the amount necessary to make annual debt service payments for outstanding state school facilities revenue bonds. The other prioritized distributions go to universities, community colleges, the Arizona Department of Education, and the State General Fund. In fiscal year 2002, these other distributions accounted for about \$183 million of the \$439 million in available Proposition 301 monies, or 42 percent.

After all of these distributions, any remaining Proposition 301 sales tax collections go to the Classroom Site Fund for allocation to public school districts, charter schools, and state schools for deaf, blind, and committed youth. In fiscal year 2002, sales tax collections, including reversions, available to the Classroom Site Fund totaled more than \$255 million. Table 2 (see page 5) also shows that sales tax revenue was less than estimated. Receipts from other sources raised the total to more than \$271 million.

Using a per-pupil rate established by the Joint Legislative Budget Committee,¹ the Arizona Department of Education distributes the monies to districts and other schools based on their attending student counts. District distributions are based on prior-year student counts, while charter school payments are based on current counts that are updated three times each year. The Arizona Schools for the Deaf and Blind are paid based on the current number of instruction days, and the Arizona Department of Juvenile Corrections is paid based on prior-year student counts. Districts received almost \$251 million of the \$271 million available; charter and state schools received the remainder.

Once the districts receive the monies, they face statutory requirements regarding how to use the funds. A.R.S. §15-977 directs districts to use at least 60 percent of Classroom Site Fund monies for teacher compensation. Districts are required to direct 20 percent toward increasing teachers' base pay and another 40 percent toward pay for performance. The remaining 40 percent can be used for six specified purposes: AIMS intervention (for the state standardized test, Arizona's Instrument to Measure Standards), class size reduction, dropout prevention, additional teacher compensation, teacher development, or teacher liability insurance. Districts are required to use these monies to supplement, not supplant, existing funding. Further, in Laws 2000, 5th Special Session, Chapter 1, Section 62, the state Legislature specified that these monies must not be used for administrative expenses.

Scope and methodology

To analyze the most current expenditure and budget data available, auditors obtained fiscal year 2002 district Annual Financial Reports (AFRs) and fiscal year 2002 and 2003 district budgets from the Arizona Department of Education. In

Statutes require the Joint Legislative Budget Committee staff to determine a per-pupil amount for distributing Proposition 301 monies, using the estimated weighted attending student count and estimated available resources of the Classroom Site Fund for the next budget year.

addition, 222 of the State's 229 non-transportation districts provided auditors with fiscal year 2002 summary accounting data.¹ The AFRs, budgets, and summary accounting data were not audited to the underlying district records. Instead, auditors performed analytical procedures using the financial data and narrative information about the uses of Classroom Site Fund monies and interviewed school district officials about significant anomalies or variances. Auditors corrected data errors that this review identified prior to calculating classroom dollar percentages and analyzing Proposition 301 expenditures.

Other information related to the analysis was obtained from the Arizona Department of Education, such as teacher experience index data and average daily membership counts. Auditors also surveyed districts to obtain information about average teacher salaries, including any increases from Proposition 301 monies; 199 districts responded. These other types of data were also reviewed for reasonableness, but the various source records were not audited.

Auditors analyzed both individual and grouped districts' classroom dollar percentages and characteristics, such as district size. After using statistical and regression analyses to identify factors that significantly affected individual district percentages, auditors analyzed these factors for their relationship to grouped district percentages and to baseline fiscal year 2001 results that were previously reported. In addition, the analysis examined the classroom dollar percentages with and without the addition of Classroom Site Fund expenditures to determine the effect of Proposition 301.

Auditors made certain adjustments that affected the classroom dollar results reported for the State's eight joint technological education districts. For the fiscal year 2002 figures used in this report, the classroom dollar percentages for these districts were calculated using only direct expenditures. In last year's report, percentages for these districts were calculated using all of their current expenditures, the same as for other districts. However, these districts typically pass-through more than 50 percent of their available funding to their member school districts. Thus, the same expenditures were being counted in the percentages for both the joint technological education districts and their member districts. These adjustments resulted in substantial changes in the classroom dollar percentage. For example, the Northern Arizona Vocational Institute of Technology District's classroom dollar percentage dropped from 83.9 percent in fiscal year 2001 to 19 percent in fiscal year 2002.

Some of the State's 239 districts were excluded from the auditors' analyses of classroom dollars and Proposition 301 monies. The statewide analysis of the percentage of dollars spent in the classroom was based on 205 districts, and the

Four school districts provided summary accounting data that was found to be incomplete or unreliable. Since these four districts filed AFRs, their classroom dollar percentages were calculated and Proposition 301 uses reported based solely on the information contained in their respective AFRs. However, their detailed data was not available for use in the more specific analyses of classroom spending factors.

analysis of Proposition 301 monies was based on 222 districts. The specific exclusions are as follows:

- When calculating the state average and individual district classroom dollar percentages, transporting districts were excluded. These districts transport all their students to other districts and, therefore, do not have classroom expenditures.
- When analyzing factors that affect the percentages, accommodation districts and joint technological education districts were also excluded. These two district types are unique in operation and few in number, and would, thereby, distort the analysis of factors generally affecting other district types.
- Four districts were excluded from the analysis of classroom dollar percentages due to incomplete or unreliable summary accounting data.
- Only 222 districts received Proposition 301 monies in fiscal year 2002. Six of the 222 districts receiving Proposition 301 monies did not submit their statutorily required report of Proposition 301 results. These districts are included in the expenditure analysis where possible, but lack specific program results. The 17 districts not receiving fiscal year 2002 Proposition 301 monies included the 10 transporting districts, 1 district that was a transporting district in the fiscal year 2001, 5 joint technological education districts formed in fiscal year 2002, and 1 county alternative district.

Table 3 (see page 8) shows the specific districts omitted from one or more portions of the analysis.

CHAPTER 1

Dollars in the classroom

Classroom dollar percentages increased only slightly, even with Proposition 301 monies

In fiscal year 2002, Arizona school districts spent an average of 58.2 cents of each dollar in their classrooms, compared to 57.7 cents in fiscal year 2001. However, if classroom spending from monies other than Proposition 301 had held steady from fiscal year 2001, the Proposition 301 monies could have raised the State's fiscal year 2002 total classroom spending to 59.1 cents of each dollar. Even with the Proposition 301 monies, over one-third of the State's districts had lower classroom dollar percentages in 2002 than in 2001. Declining classroom dollar percentages were associated with increases in spending for administration and with declining use of non-Proposition 301 monies for instructional salaries. Districts with the greatest decreases in classroom dollar percentages increased their per-pupil administrative expenditures from non-Proposition 301 monies at over eight times the per-pupil administrative increase of districts with the greatest increases in classroom dollar percentages. Most of these administrative increases occured in district-level expenditures.

Districts spent 58.2 cents of each dollar in the classroom

Based on auditors' analysis of district accounting data, Arizona's statewide average for the percentage of each dollar spent in the classroom has increased slightly, from 57.7 percent last year to 58.2 percent in fiscal year 2002. This percentage is somewhat below the most recent national average reported by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). In the most recent national data available, NCES reported the national average for fiscal year 2000 spending on instruction was 61.7 percent, the same as in fiscal year 1999.

For the 205 districts analyzed, individual district percentages for classroom spending ranged from about 34 to 89 percent. However, this large range is somewhat misleading, as almost two-thirds, or 132 districts, are within 5 percent of the state average. Only 27 of the districts spent less than 50 percent of their current operating dollars in the classroom. Table 4 groups districts in comparison to the statewide average.

Districts with very high or very low percentages of classroom dollars are typically very small districts with fewer than 200 students. Also, although special purpose districts, such as accommodation and joint technological education districts, are not included in our statewide analysis, they too have very high or very low classroom dollar percentages. The small and special-purpose districts tend to have very high or very low nonclassroom expenditures, such as food service or administration. For example, among the State's eight Joint Technological Education Districts, only one maintains its own

campus and provides direct education to students. In fiscal year 2002, the seven others spent 1.5 cents of each dollar in the classroom, 20.8 cents for other purposes such as administration, and passed 77.7 cents on to their member districts.¹

Dollars not spent in the classroom

Statewide, about 42 percent of districts' current operating dollars are not spent in the classroom. As shown in Table 5 (see page 11), the two largest categories of non-classroom expenditures—plant operation and administration—both declined as a percentage of total current expenditures since fiscal year 2001. This would be expected since the additional Proposition 301 funding received in 2002 would generally not be spent in these categories.

Plant operation and maintenance includes expenditures for the care and upkeep of buildings and equipment, utilities, and security. This category accounted for 11.8 percent of all current expenditures, down from 12.5 percent in fiscal year 2001. Administration includes expenses associated with a district's governing board, the superintendent, school principals' offices, and business and central support

Laws 2002, Chapter 330, section 51, placed temporary limitations on joining or forming joint technological education districts, effective November 30, 2002. The State's existing 8 Joint Technological Education Districts have 41 member districts.

services. This category accounted for 10.2 percent of all current expenditures, down from 10.5 percent in fiscal year 2001.¹ NCES data shows that the national average for school district administrative costs has been about 11 percent for the past 5 years.

Table 5 also includes 1999 NCES data, the most recent national data available for expenditures by function. As shown, despite the decline in the statewide percentage spent on plant operations, it is still almost 2 percent above the national average. Further, the statewide averages for student support and food service costs are also above the 1999 national averages.

Factors associated with higher or lower classroom spending

In analyzing Arizona districts' expenditures, several factors identified as being associated with classroom spending in 2001 remained factors in 2002. Specifically, the number of students in a district, teacher salaries, and teacher experience positively relate to dollars being spent in the classroom. That is, as these factors increase, so does the classroom dollar percentage. Conversely, spending on food service, transportation, administration and federal and state programs had a

negative relationship, as increased spending for these types of costs was associated with lower classroom dollar percentages.

Factors associated with higher classroom spending—The factors positively related to the percentage of dollars spent in the classroom include the following:

• District size—Generally, the more students a district has, the higher the percentage it spends in the classroom. As shown in Table 6, the classroom dollar percentage increases as the number of students in a district increases. This may occur because larger districts can spread non-instructional, fixed-type costs over more students and still have additional dollars left to devote to the classroom. This trend was similarly evident in fiscal year 2001.

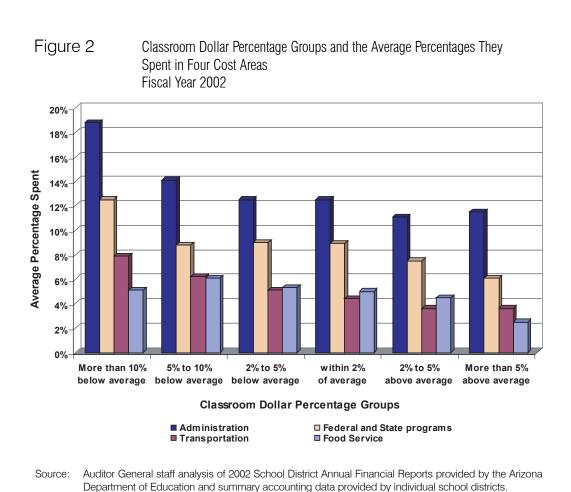

• Average teacher salary and teacher experience index—Generally, the percentage of dollars spent in the classroom increases as the average teacher salary increases. Because instructional salaries represent such a large percentage of a district's total current expenditures (53 percent on average), salary increases could be expected to have such an effect. Based on data collected by ADE through the School District Employee Report, districts with the highest classroom dollar percentages pay an average of \$2,700 more per teacher than districts with lower percentages.¹ Similarly, the percentage of dollars spent in the classroom increases as the Teacher Experience Index increases. Teachers with more experience generally have higher salaries. Thus as a district's index increases, its average teacher salary will typically increase.

Data in the School District Employee Report does not usually include Proposition 301 performance pay or stipends resulting from menu option programs.

Factors associated with lower classroom spending—As in fiscal year 2001, four factors continue to be associated with lower classroom spending. As administrative costs, food service costs, transportation costs, and expenditures for federal and state programs increase, the percentage of dollars spent in the classroom decreases.

As shown in Figure 2, districts with the highest classroom dollar percentages, those more than 5 percent above average, tend to spend a lower percentage of their dollars on federal and state programs and food service than all other groups. These districts also spend a significantly lower percentage of their dollars on administration and transportation than districts with the lowest classroom dollar percentages, those more than 10 percent below average.

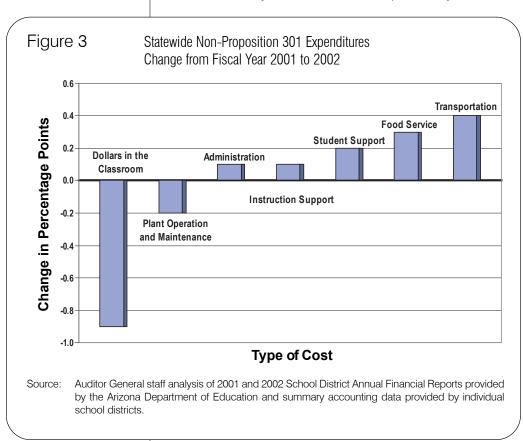


Factors not associated with classroom spending—As in fiscal year 2001, auditors analyzed other probable factors for relationships to districts' classroom spending and again found that district type, desegregation spending, and budget overrides had no apparent effect on classroom dollar percentages. That is, for the additional funding that desegregation and budget overrides provided, dollars generally flowed into the classroom at the same rate as other district dollars.

More than one-third of districts decreased their classroom dollar percentage

If districts had spent their non-Proposition 301 monies in fiscal year 2002 in the same manner that they spent their monies in fiscal year 2001, the additional Proposition 301 monies they spent in fiscal year 2002 would have increased the statewide classroom dollar percentage to 59.1 percent. However, instead of increasing by 1.4 percent, the statewide average went up only 0.5 percent, to 58.2 percent.

Overall, more than one-third, or 78 districts, had a lower classroom dollar percentage in fiscal year 2002 than in the previous year, even with the addition of Proposition 301

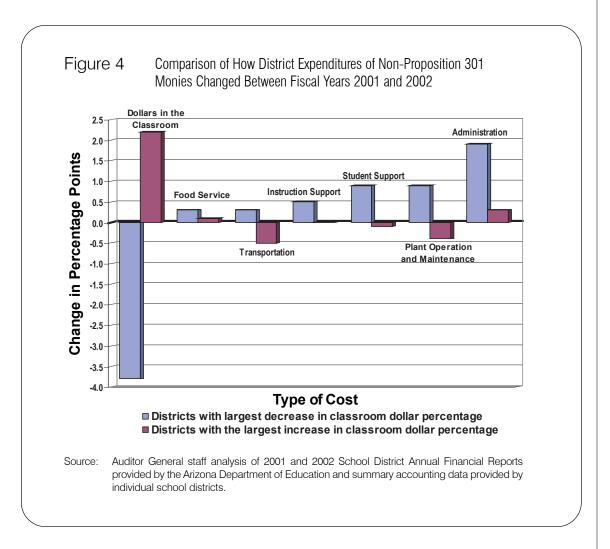


monies. Without the Proposition 301 monies, the statewide average classroom dollar percentage would have declined nearly a full percentage point from the 2001 total, to 56.8 percent, and nearly 60 percent of all districts would have had a lower classroom dollar percentage in 2002 than the prior year.

Figure 3 shows the overall change in how the 205 districts included in the analysis spent their non-Proposition 301 monies. Districts spent a smaller proportion of these monies in the classroom and in plant operations, and a larger proportion in food service, transportation, administration, and support services.

Declining districts increased administrative spending

Districts with declining classroom dollar percentages increased administrative spending and decreased spending on instructional salaries from monies other than Proposition 301 funds. As shown in Figure 4, when comparing groups of districts with the largest increases and decreases in classroom dollar percentages, the most significant difference occurred in administration costs. Significant differences also occurred in the instructional salaries portion of the classroom dollars category.



Administrative costs—For the 40 districts whose classroom spending declined the most during fiscal year 2002 (shown in blue in Figure 4 above), administrative spending from monies other than Proposition 301 increased an average of \$151 perpupil, or 19 percent. These increases occurred at both the district (including General Administration, and Business, Central, and Other Support Services) and school level.

Case Examples

A small, rural district in Apache County with a declining classroom dollar percentage increased its total administrative costs by 13 percent, while also experiencing a 27 percent drop in its attending student count.

One medium, urban district in Maricopa County hired two additional teachers, yet decreased its non-Proposition 301 spending on instructional salaries by 3 percent and increased administrative spending by 16 percent.

About two-thirds of these increases, or \$100 per-pupil, were in the district-level expenses. The increases in administrative costs were over eight times the per-pupil administrative spending increase of the districts that had the greatest increases in classroom spending.

Instructional salaries—Districts with the largest decreases in classroom dollar percentage decreased their percentage of non-Proposition 301 monies allocated to instructional salaries by 2 percentage points, or \$23 per pupil. By contrast, districts with the highest increase in classroom dollar percentages maintained their fiscal year 2001 percentage of such monies allocated to instructional salaries.

Individual district percentages

Table 7 (see pages 17 through 19) lists the fiscal year 2002 classroom dollar percentages for each of the 209 districts grouped by size, 12 accommodation districts and 8 joint technological education districts. For further information, see the attached Appendix which provides alphabetically organized one-page summaries for each district. Along with other information, these pages show each district's comparative classroom dollar ranking from 1 (highest) to 229 (lowest).

CHAPTER 2

Districts' uses of Proposition 301 monies

Of the nearly \$251 million received in Proposition 301 monies, districts spent \$196.5 million, or about 78 percent. The remaining amounts, which carried over to fiscal year 2003, were generally not spent due to late distribution of monies and delayed performance measures. Districts exceeded the statutory requirement to spend at least 60 percent of their Proposition 301 monies on teacher compensation; as a group, they spent approximately 99 percent of the total amount on this one item. They varied in the degree to which they spent monies on the five other statutorily allowed purposes: AIMS intervention, class size reduction, dropout prevention, teacher development, or teacher liability insurance.

Districts received \$251 million and spent \$196 million

Proposition 301 monies made available to districts totaled nearly \$251 million for fiscal year 2002. Because the monies are distributed on a per-pupil basis, individual school district amounts varied greatly. They ranged from a low of \$810 for Blue Elementary School District to a high of \$21 million for Mesa Unified School District, As shown in Table 8, half of fiscal year 2002 distributions went to the State's 14 largest districts.

Districts spent \$196.5 million of the total they received, about 78 percent. Three main factors contributed to districts not spending a higher portion of their Proposition 301 monies. First, for most of the fiscal year, districts were limited to spending only the cash that was available in the Classroom Site Fund (CSF). In May 2002, a statutory change allowed districts to borrow cash from other funds as needed to make payments up to their budget limits in the CSF. As this change came relatively late in the fiscal year, many districts continued to only spend monies as they were received. Second, districts received their final fiscal year 2002 allocation in August, and many districts did not spend those monies until after fiscal year 2003 had begun. Third, some districts noted that delayed performance measure data caused them to make some of their performance pay-based salary payments in the subsequent fiscal year from the unspent, carry-forward monies.

As shown in Table 9, districts spent most of their Base Pay and Menu Option

allocations, but only about two-

thirds of their Performance Pay monies. Thirty-six districts made no Performance Pay distributions during fiscal year 2002, compared to 17 districts not spending their Menu Option monies.

Moreover, five very small districts reported that they made no Classroom Site Fund expenditures during the fiscal year. These five districts had CSF revenues ranging from \$810 to \$15,083 and totaling \$31,989. Three of these districts

indicated that governing board and/or plan requirements had not been met for spending the monies. Another district was waiting to receive test score results.

Almost all Proposition 301 monies were spent for teacher compensation

As shown in Table 10 (see page 23), about 99 percent of total CSF expenditures paid for salaries and benefits, while the remaining 1 percent was spent for purchased services and supplies. For purposes of Proposition 301 expenditures, the Attorney General determined that "certificated teachers, certified teachers, and others employed to provide instruction to students on matters related to the school's educational mission are eligible for the increases in compensation." Under this

definition, employees other than classroom teachers were sometimes identified as eligible for Proposition 301 pay. Classroom teachers received approximately 91 percent of districts' Proposition 301 monies, and other eligible employees received nearly 9 percent.

While districts used most of their Proposition 301 monies to increase instructional salaries, inconsistencies in reported data limited our ability to precisely measure the amount of the increases. According to School District Employee Report (SDER) data collected by the Arizona Department of Education (ADE), the statewide average teacher salary increased from \$37,176 in fiscal year 2001 to \$39,973 in fiscal year 2002. However, instructions for submitting this information did not specify how to report Proposition 301-related compensation, and our analysis of the district-reported data found many inconsistencies in the way districts reported the information. As a result, auditors asked each district to provide its average teacher salary with and without Proposition 301 monies, and its average Proposition 301 pay increase. The 199 responding districts reported that their teacher salaries increased an average of 8.8 percent in fiscal year 2002, with increases ranging from less than 1 percent up to 20 percent. These districts reported average teacher salaries including Proposition 301 monies, ranged from a low of \$21,997 to a high of \$48,142. Proposition 301 pay increases ranged from \$280 to \$5,875 per eligible employee.

Districts directed monies toward various Proposition 301 purposes

Although districts reported spending most of their Proposition 301 monies specifically for teacher compensation, many districts also directed monies to other

areas. Teachers generally received these monies as well, but performed additional work relating to AIMS Intervention, dropout prevention, or other activities to earn them. As shown in Table 11, most of the spending in these areas other than teacher compensation focused on teacher development and class size reduction. The smallest and the two very largest districts directed approximately 22 percent of their monies to other programs or purposes, compared to about 14 percent for medium and large districts.

One-fourth of districts spent monies for AIMS intervention— Approximately one-fourth, or 53 districts, reported using Proposition 301 monies for AIMS intervention. Districts most commonly cited using the monies to provide afterschool tutoring or programs during the summer or intersession. They also paid teachers for extended school days and Saturday classes, purchased instructional materials, developed assessments and curriculum and hired instructional assistants, teachers, and district staff. For example:

- Agua Fria Union High School District spent \$98,017 to develop 13 uniform course assessments that were aligned to state standards in English, math, science, and social science.
- Ash Creek Elementary School District spent \$8,460 to add 1 hour to the school day on Tuesdays and Thursdays to provide tutoring in reading, writing, and math. Nearly all of the District's 50 students participated.

- Coolidge Unified School District spent \$17,542 for a variety of activities including
 a recovery school program for junior-high and high-school students with failing
 grades and poor attendance. Recovery school allowed junior-high and highschool students to obtain individualized instruction and earn course credits. Of
 the 104 students participating, 55 earned passing course grades through the
 program. The District also used these monies for summer school, after-school
 tutoring and activities, and developing student assessments.
- Elfrida Elementary School District spent \$1,129 to purchase literacy diagnostic tests. The tests were administered to approximately 80 students in grades K-3 to show students' strengths and weaknesses to enable teachers to adjust instruction.

More than one-fifth of the districts spent monies on class-size reduction—About 22 percent, or 48 districts, reported spending a portion of their Proposition 301 monies to reduce class size. Districts hired new teachers to reduce overall class sizes or to address specific class-size concerns. For example, at least 4 districts hired math teachers to reduce class size. In other cases, districts increased existing part-time staff to full-time and/or hired teacher's aides to help provide more individualized help to students.

- Avondale Elementary School District spent \$45,101 toward hiring one part-time and two full-time teachers to accommodate 13.5 percent district growth and reduce class sizes.
- Prescott Unified School District spent \$95,856 to reduce the student/teacher ratio in physical education, music, kindergarten, sixth grade, music/band, and drama classes by one to three students each.
- Eloy Elementary School District spent \$14,926 to avoid a reduction in force and retain a part-time teacher.
- Duncan Unified District spent \$13,323 toward adding two full-time instructional assistants to help teachers teach keyboarding, library skills, and other academic areas.

About one-fifth spent monies for dropout prevention—About 17 percent, or 36 districts, reported spending some of their Proposition 301 monies for dropout prevention activities or programs. Districts cited using a variety of activities, including after-school tutoring, intersession classes, Saturday classes, remediation summer school, and alternative learning environments to serve students in danger of dropping out or being suspended. For example:

 Chino Valley Unified School District spent \$2,690 to help fund its Bridges-At-Risk Program, which enabled 34 students to make up high school credits and get

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back on track toward high school graduation. The teacher for the "Bridges" program works evenings and weekends to allow students who need to maintain a job to continue their education.

- Crane Elementary School District spent \$47,770 to pay for alternative education programs. One program served 15 students who may otherwise have faced disciplinary action such as suspension or expulsion. The number of long-term suspended or expelled students declined from 20 in 2001 to 2 in 2002. A second program helped promote 6 of 12 students from the eighth grade. The high school district offered challenge exams to students in the program, who then received credit for their achievements.
- Mesa Unified School District spent \$445,610 for a variety of dropout prevention activities. The District hired teachers to work with specific groups of students and their families on issues such as attendance, substance abuse, and other behaviors associated with an increased risk of dropping out of school. The district also provided alternative learning centers and Saturday School to at-risk students at two schools.
- Kingman Unified School District spent \$121,790 to hire a student advocate, guidance counselors, and security personnel. Adding these positions allowed for weekly meetings with students concerning grades and attendance. According to the District, this type of regular contact resulted in more students passing their classes and staying in school.

More than 40 percent of the districts spent monies for teacher development—Approximately 41 percent, or 89 districts, reported using Proposition 301 monies for teacher development. Districts reported sending teachers to workshops, compensating teachers for time spent in training sessions, paying for tuition reimbursement, paying outside instructors to provide teacher trainings, and developing and providing in-house training on numerous subjects. Furthermore, some districts either encouraged or required teachers to complete individualized professional development programs. For example:

- Florence Unified School District spent \$155,534 to create a staff development department. Three teachers were hired to staff the department and to create a course catalog with classes available for teachers to attend. Courses included such topics as creating lesson plans, helping students with science projects, and improving students' reading skills. The District reported increased teacher retention and student test scores.
- J.O. Combs Elementary School District spent \$15,067 toward staff development activities. The District required each teacher to complete 40 hours of professional development relating to their field of study or to the school-wide goal of improving students' language arts skills.

- Page Unified School District spent \$84,000 to hire instructional facilitators at each school to observe, coach, and collaborate with teachers in the areas of standards assessments and effective instruction techniques.
- Saddle Mountain Unified School District spent \$3,029 to hire a reading specialist to provide training for its 26 teachers.

Little use of monies for teacher liability insurance—Only 1 district reported spending \$15,000 from menu options monies for teacher liability insurance. In the Proposition 301 spending plans provided to auditors for fiscal year 2002, none of the districts planned to use monies for this purpose.

Further information about how each district reported spending its Proposition 301 monies, its classroom dollar percentage, and related data is provided in the attached Appendix.

Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.21 percent of the District's \$45,176,464 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,671 in salary.
- After-school and special tutoring sessions were provided.
- 8 teachers were hired to reduce class sizes in either English or math, depending on schools' needs.
- 2 teachers were added to the District's dropout prevention school, which serves students who are having academic difficulties and are at risk of dropping out. The school's dropout rate declined by 3 percent.
- All 448 teachers accomplished performance goals that involved completing teacher development courses and improved dropout and graduation rates.
- Monies were also used to pay for teacher development activities, including workshops and strategy sessions.
