## Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional $\$ 6,222$ in salary, each librarian earned an additional $\$ 4,763$, and each counselor earned an additional \$4,617.


## Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on individual performance.
- Teachers accomplished achievement goals based on students' Individualized Education Plans, course outlines, and academic standards.
- Eligible employees also established goals for participating in professional development activities, demonstrating skills, tutoring students, and communicating with parents.


## Menu

- Monies were used primarily to increase eligible employee compensation.
- 1 math class was added to reduce class sizes by 10 percent. According to the District, this resulted in higher math scores on the AIMS test.
- For dropout prevention, 2 schools provided afterschool tutoring and 35 students at a third school participated in an after-school credit recovery program to earn credits toward graduation.
