



# Proposition 301

## District-reported 2004 results

Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, counselor, collaborative peer teacher, and media specialist earned between \$1,333 and \$3,290 in additional salary.

### Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district, school, and individual performance.
- Student achievement goals were set for the District, for groups of similar schools, and for individual schools. The District accomplished its goal, as did 13 of 15 schools, and 44 percent of teachers in the school groups.
- Teachers completed 15 hours of staff development each, tutored students, received acceptable performance evaluations, and participated in teamwork and mentoring activities.
- Parents participated in School Improvement Councils and school events and activities.

#### Menu

- More than 3 teachers and 16 instructional assistants were hired to reduce class sizes, and peer teachers were paid to mentor and develop staff.
- Monies were also used to increase teacher pay and to pay for AIMS intervention activities.
