



District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned between \$1,091 and \$3,303 in additional compensation.
- 10 of 12 teachers met all performance pay goals, which involved such things as producing quarterly newsletters, using classroom computers, attending a development workshop, and assigning classroom projects.
