



Proposition 301 expenditures were 5.48 percent of the District's \$7,681,504 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned between \$4,068 and \$4,843 in additional compensation, including \$768 for medical coverage.
- 72 percent of students made 1 year's progress as measured by standardized tests.
- The District's average score for high-school formal writing assessments increased by approximately 14 percent.
- A history class was added, which reduced class sizes from 36 to 27 students.
- A remediation summer school program resulted in 13 of 13 students receiving credit in math, 41 of 45 receiving credit in English, and 17 of 17 students receiving credit in social studies.
- 16 teachers completed developmental classes associated with their performance goals.
