District-reported 2004 results
Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher, instructional aide, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned between $\$ 3,901$ and $\$ 4,309$ in additional salary.


## Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school performance.
- Using standardized tests as a measurement, each elementary and middle school established student achievement goals in reading, language, and math; and the high school established goals in reading and math.
- 5 schools met their goals.


## Menu

- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- To reduce class sizes, 1 elementary school teacher was hired along with instructional aides for kindergarten through 5th-grade classrooms.
