



- On average, each teacher, certified counselor, social worker, librarian, speech language pathologist, occupational therapist, and mentor earned an additional \$1,800 in compensation.
- Teachers also earned additional performance pay, which was distributed in fiscal year 2003.
- 2 teachers were hired to reduce high-school class sizes.
