

Proposition 301 expenditures were 3.0 percent of the District's \$984,180 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned \$2,643 in additional salary.
- In addition, each teacher earned an average of \$1,370 in performance pay, which was paid in fiscal year 2003.
- 11 teachers accomplished performance goals involving increased student achievement on standardized tests and on kindergarten tests.
- Early literacy diagnostic tests for grades K-3 were purchased and administered to approximately 80 students to help teachers better address students' needs.
- 11 teachers attended a reading program. Teachers • also attended classes about communication skills, writing instruction, and math instruction, and received monies for earning college credit.
