



Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.66 percent of the District's \$32,495,019 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,200 in compensation.
- 8 schools participated in AIMS intervention activities, which included after-school programs and tutoring.
- The percentage of students demonstrating proficiency on the AIMS test increased in 3rd grade reading and math; 5th grade reading, math, and language; 8th grade math; and 10th grade writing. AIMS scores exceeded state averages in 7 of 12 categories.
- The dropout rate decreased by 2 percent.
- 10 teachers were hired to reduce class sizes.
- Monies also paid for professional development activities.
