

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned an additional \$3,280 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district, school, and individual performance.
- Elementary-school goals were linked to increased student achievement, teacher involvement in leadership activities, parent and student satisfaction, and homework completion rates.
- Junior high-school goals focused on improvements to student writing skills and attendance.
- High-school goals focused on increased student achievement and school safety.

- 10 teachers were hired to reduce class sizes.
- Eligible employees received compensation increases.
- 1,450 students participated in dropout prevention activities, including after-school tutoring and study halls.
- The high-school dropout rate declined by 3.01 percent.
