Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

The annual expenditure limitation report (AELR) is presented as prescribed by the uniform expenditure reporting system (UERS), as required by Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.) §41-1279.07. The AELR excludes expenditures, expenses, or deductions of certain revenues specified in the Arizona Constitution, Article IX, §20, from the total expenditures, expenses, or deductions reported in the fund financial statements.

In accordance with the UERS, a note to the AELR is presented below for any exclusion claimed on part II and each subtraction or addition in the reconciliation that cannot be traced directly to an amount reported in the fund financial statements. All references to financial statement amounts in the following notes refer to the statement of revenues, expenditures, and changes in fund balances for the governmental funds and the statement of changes in fiduciary net position for the fiduciary funds.

Note 2

The exclusion claimed for debt service requirements consists of interest and other charges on bonded indebtedness of \$1,487,284 in the governmental funds. In addition, the exclusion claimed for debt service requirements consists of principal and interest payments for capital leases totaling \$423,727, which were reported as general government expenditures, highways and streets expenditures, and public safety expenditures of \$312,727, \$54,217, and \$56,783, respectively, in the governmental funds.

Note 3

The exclusion claimed for dividends, interest, and gains on the sale or redemption of investment securities of \$19,275 in the governmental funds includes investment earnings expended. Remaining investment earnings of the governmental funds of \$30,818 and interest on delinquent taxes expended of \$91,386 have been carried forward to future years.

Note 4

The exclusion claimed for trustee or custodian in the governmental funds consists of \$646,106 in county contributions to the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System for acute care, uncompensated care, and administrative costs; and in the fiduciary funds, the exclusion consists of \$70,788,611 in distributions to investment pool participants.

The exclusion claimed for amounts received for distribution to school districts consists of federal and state revenues recorded as education expenditures for operating an accommodation school.

The subtraction for long-term care contributions the State Treasurer withheld consists of transaction privilege taxes the State Treasurer withheld to meet the County's share of long-term care costs that was reported as

a revenue and an offsetting expenditure in the County's governmental funds. Consequently, this expenditure has been subtracted on the reconciliation.

Note 9

The subtraction of \$117,040 for separate legal entities established under Arizona Revised Statutes consists of expenditures and transfers out of special assessment districts included within the County's reporting entity, but not included in the Economic Estimates Commission base limit calculations, and are reported in the governmental funds category in the fund financial statements.

Note 10

The subtraction of \$57,803 for required fees/reimbursements paid to Arizona state agencies consists of \$18,966 paid to the Arizona Department of Juvenile Corrections pursuant to A.R.S. §41-2832 for committed youth confinement cost-sharing and \$38,837 paid to the Arizona Department of Administration pursuant to A.R.S. §42-5041 for administrative, program, and operating costs.
