## Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional $\$ 5,352$ in salary and each librarian earned an additional \$5,645. Each counselor earned between \$2,348 and \$6,089 in additional salary.


## Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on individual and school performance.
- Student test scores at each school increased, on average.
- Teachers received acceptable performance evaluations, added at least 2 graded writing assignments to their curriculums, and implemented the accelerated reader program in their classrooms.
