



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,987 in salary, and each instructional aide earned an additional \$1,020.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school performance.
- The goals called for students' test scores, on average, to increase by at least 5 percent on the Stanford achievement test in grades 1 through 8.
- Additionally, goals called for students' AIMS test scores in grades 3, 5, and 8 to show improvement, and for the total number of students meeting or exceeding state standards to increase.

Menu

 Monies were used to provide after-school and intersession AIMS intervention tutoring to students in grades 3, 5, and 8. The District indicated that the tutoring sessions contributed to meeting its performance goals.
