## District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher and librarian earned between \$2,116 and \$2,330 in additional salary. In addition, instructional aides, speech pathologists, and counselors were eligible for performance pay and earned between $\$ 950$ and $\$ 1,265$ each, on average.


## Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- High-school, middle-school, and special education students demonstrated measurable academic progress; and the number of students improving their reading and writing scores on the AIMS test increased.
- Elementary-school students improved reading and math skills.
- Teacher attendance increased.
- Middle- and high-school promotion rates increased.
