District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher received an additional \$3,428 in salary.
- Elementary- and high-school students' test scores showed limited improvement.
- The dropout rate at the District's alternative high school declined slightly.
- All teachers participated in professional development activities, including workshops and graduate classes. 3 teachers completed advanced degrees; 4 completed requirements for new certification endorsements.
