Proposition 301 expenditures were 3.52 percent of the District's $\$ 1,245,026$ current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,651 in compensation.
- All 12 teachers performed additional duties, such as working on committees, acting as special program coordinators, and participating in summer school and after-school activities.
- All 12 teachers accomplished performance goals involving student achievement, student involvement, and positive responses on parent survey.
- All students in regular classes who had been with the District for more than 1 year made 1 year's progress as measured by standardized tests.
- 80 percent of students in grades 4 through 8 were involved in extracurricular activities.
