



## District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher earned an additional \$5,456 in salary.

#### Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on district performance.
- Goals were linked to student achievement on standardized tests, teacher professional development, and parent and student satisfaction.
- 4 teachers earned a total of 198 staff development hours.
- Schools received positive ratings by students and parents on satisfaction surveys.

#### Menu

- 1 educational aide was hired to reduce class size.
- Monies were also used to increase teacher compensation and to pay for professional development activities.
