



Proposition 301 expenditures were 1.89 percent of the District's \$1,031,387 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$2,239 in compensation.
- The District retained all of its teachers.
- All 8 teachers accomplished performance goals, which involved developing classroom goals, integrated teaching units, and related lessons; managing the classroom with a weekly referral rate of less than 10 percent; completing 8 parent contacts per student per year; participating in at least 8 events outside typical classroom expectations; and improving student achievement as measured by standardized tests.
- Each teacher completed more than 80 hours of training in topics ranging from literacy to technology.
