

Total

• On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned between \$1,464 and \$2,171 in additional salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school performance.
- All but 1 school accomplished student achievement goals, which were primarily focused on increasing students' reading and writing skills.
- Each school received approval ratings of 88 percent or ٠ higher on annual parent satisfaction surveys.

Menu

- About 40 percent of monies were used to increase eligible employee base pay.
- Teachers earned additional monies for participating in professional development activities, including mentoring, literacy training, and teacher academies.
- Monies were also used to pay for AIMS intervention ٠ activities, including tutoring, intersession, and summer school classes.
