



Proposition 301 expenditures were 6.66 percent of the District's \$3,692,452 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher, counselor, and librarian earned an additional \$5,997 in compensation.
- Monies were also used for AIMS intervention, as well as to pay each teacher for attending 6 workshops held for their personal development in the classroom.
- Teachers earned performance pay by achieving goals involving student achievement, teacher performance evaluations, teacher goals and state standards curriculum alignment.
- Students in the 3rd and 5th grades met the goal for standardized test scores.
