



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher, librarian, and counselor earned an additional \$4,479 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district and individual performance.
- When compared to last year, the percentage of students meeting or exceeding state standards on the AIMS test increased by 7 percent in grade 3; 13 percent in grade 5; 12 percent in grade 8; and 11 percent in high school.
- Elementary school students' standardized test scores in reading and math maintained or improved.
- Teachers received acceptable performance evaluations.

Menu

- Monies were used to compensate teachers for focusing instruction on state academic standards as measured by lesson plans, curriculum maps, and observations.
- Teachers also earned monies for completing 20 hours of professional development and for demonstrating proficiency with technology.
