



District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned between \$2,870 and \$4,670 in additional compensation.
- 159 teachers accomplished all performance goals, and 5 teachers accomplished 80 percent or more of their performance goals. Goals were set by teachers and approved by principals. Goals included such things as increasing students' attendance, scores on standardized tests, and math and writing skills.
