



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher earned an additional \$2,362 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goal, which was based on school and individual performance.
- The goal called for standards-based instruction and for student performance to be measured quarterly and reported to parents. According to the District, this has resulted in all students learning a standardsbased curriculum and has enabled parents to know what their child has achieved.
