



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned an additional \$4,473 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school performance.
- At least 50 percent of students in grades kindergarten through 12 demonstrated increased reading and math skills as measured by standardized tests.

Menu

- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation for refining and implementing a district-wide improvement program.
- 2 teachers were hired to reduce 5th-grade class sizes from 25 to 22 students and 7th-grade class sizes from 24 to 22 students.
- A mentoring program was established for newly hired teachers. Each of the 38 new teachers met weekly with one of the 19 mentors.
