



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher earned an additional \$2,403 in salary, which does not include a portion of performance pay distributed in fiscal year 2004.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- Students' AIMS test scores met or exceeded state averages in at least 2 of 3 categories, which included reading, writing, and math.
- Teachers encouraged increased parent involvement through activities such as family nights, science nights, and newsletters.
- Teachers received acceptable performance evaluations.

Menu

- Monies were used primarily to compensate teachers for working additional hours outside of the regular school day.
- 17 teachers also received compensation for attending a reading workshop.
