



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher earned between \$782 and \$3,084 in additional salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school performance.

- Student attendance improved by more than 10 percent.

Menu

- Teachers were compensated for conducting a series of family and community workshops designed to give parents a better understanding of the AIMS test and state academic standards, and to provide them with tips on how to help their children succeed.
