## District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$1,703 in salary, and each instructional aide earned an additional \$455.


## Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on individual and school performance.
- Goals were linked to teacher participation in professional development and leadership activities, and to increased parent involvement, including parent workshops, volunteer programs, and extended parentteacher conferences.


## Menu

- 1 teacher was hired to reduce 1 st-grade class size to 25 students.
- 11 teachers earned approximately 7 credit hours each of professional development in math and reading.
