



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, and counselor earned an additional \$4,624 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- 75 percent of students improved their writing and math skills as measured by pre- and post-tests.
- Teachers were required to complete 3 hours of graduate-level course work, attend 20 hours of workshops and seminars, provide 20 hours of mentoring to other teachers, or perform 20 hours of additional duties such as committee work or tutoring.

Menu

- Monies were used to compensate teachers for performing additional duties.
- 29 teachers earned monies for participating in curriculum mapping and planning, textbook adoption, extracurricular student activities and clubs, or providing after-school enrichment activities for students.
- 14 teachers earned monies for providing AIMS intervention tutoring.
- 6 teachers earned monies for tutoring students at risk of dropping out.
