



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher and librarian earned between \$4,039 and \$4,232 in additional salary. Each counselor earned an additional \$3,231.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district and individual performance.
- Goals were linked to increased student achievement in reading and math; and to teachers' completing 15 hours of professional development activities, and 2 parent contacts each semester at the elementary-school level and 1 at the high-school level.

Menu

- Monies were used primarily to increase eligible employee compensation and to pay for classroom supplies.
- 1 math and 1 English teacher were hired to assist with AIMS intervention efforts at the high school.
