Proposition 301 expenditures were 5.12 percent of the District's \$969,408 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional $\$ 4,800$ in salary.
- Teachers earned performance pay based on their spring performance evaluations.
- 69 percent more 3rd-grade students, 100 percent more 5 th-grade students, and 74 percent more 8th-grade students met or exceeded standards on the AIMS test compared to the prior year.
- 45 percent of staff voluntarily enrolled in summer college courses.
