



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, counselor, nurse, and curriculum coordinator earned an additional \$3,143 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on district and school performance.
- Unexcused absences at the high school were reduced by 60 percent and tardies were reduced by 53 percent.
- Disciplinary referrals at the elementary and middle schools were reduced by 50 percent.
- 34 percent of parents accessed student records via the Internet, and 25 percent of high-school and 10 percent of elementary-school students' parents received student progress reports via e-mail.
