
#### Annual financial statement audit

The University's fiscal year 2025 reported financial information is reliable. We did not report any deficiencies or noncompliance.


#### Audit's purpose

To express our opinion on the University's financial statements and, if applicable, to report findings over noncompliance with certain laws and regulations or other financial deficiencies.

#### Largest primary revenue sources FY 2025

Tuition and fees, net of financial assistance 49.4%

Includes charges to students for educational services, net of any University student financial assistance revenues that were used to cover the students' tuition and fees.

Government grants and contracts 19.7%

Includes federal and State government grant programs and contracts awarded mostly for student financial aid and research and development programs.

## Largest primary expense purposes FY 2025

Instruction 30.9%

Costs to provide instruction for all degree and certificate programs.

► Academic and institutional support 19.6%

Costs for University-wide planning, management, and administrative support services, including fiscal operations, information technology, and course development.

► Student services and scholarships 14.9%

Costs that support social and cultural development, career guidance, financial aid administration, admissions, and records, as well as grants, scholarships, and tuition and fee waivers.

## University's net position increased in FY 2025

University revenues were \$242.8 million more than its expenses, increasing its total net position to \$2.5 billion at June 30, 2025. Net position includes all assets, such as buildings, vehicles, and cash and investments, less all liabilities, such as unpaid pension and other payroll obligations, long-term debt, and accounts payable. Of the total net position, \$1.8 billion is restricted by external parties or is not in spendable form, and the remaining \$777.8 million is unrestricted.
