


Classroom Dollars

District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$1,514 in salary; each instructional aide and librarian earned between \$605 and \$631. Monies were also used to provide \$1,236 salary increases to nonteaching staff, including office staff, cafeteria workers, and custodians.

Performance

- The District did not report whether it accomplished its goals.
- Goals were linked to increasing student reading and writing scores by 5 percent on standardized tests; developing a student interest survey and a policy to motivate students to attend school; coordinating lesson plans with state standards and evaluating students; participating in or providing tutoring, service projects, and extra-curricular activities; and increasing parent contacts and involvement by 5 percent.
